Background

- The Wisconsin BadgerCare project is a statewide Medicaid expansion that seeks to utilize the State's current managed care delivery system, also known as BadgerCare, to provide health care services to both SCHIP and Medicaid beneficiaries.
- The demonstration includes both Title XXI and Title XIX expansion groups.
- Effective with the June 1, 2007 renewal, Title XIX funding will cover the BadgerCare Adult Parents with incomes below 100 percent of the FPL (who have always been funded under Title XIX) and Parents with incomes from 100 to 130 percent of the FPL (new group funded under Title XIX). Children ages 0 to 19 years and Parents with incomes between 130 to 200 percent of the FPL will continue to be funded by Title XXI.

Amendment

- **Amendment # 1** - On January 18, 2001, the State received approval from CMS that allowed Demonstration populations 1 and 3 to be Title XXI funded expansion groups. Also if in a given year the State utilized

all Title XXI funds these two groups would revert to funding under Title XIX expansion groups.

Eligibility

The BadgerCare demonstration eligibles are defined as follows:

- **Demonstration Population 1** - Children ages 0 to 5 years with net family incomes above 133% up to and including 200% of the Federal poverty level (FPL), and children 6 to 19 years who have net family incomes above 100% up to and including 200% of the FPL and who are optional, targeted, low-income children as defined in section 1905(u)(2)(B) of the Social Security Act (the Act). Children are funded through title XXI.
- **Demonstration Population 2-** 2a- Uninsured custodial parents of children who are eligible under the Medicaid State plan or included in Demonstration Population 1, and the uninsured spouses of these custodial parents, with net family incomes up to and including 100% of the FPL and who are themselves not eligible for Medicaid under the State plan, and 2b - Uninsured custodial parents of children who are eligible under the Medicaid State plan or included in Demonstration Population 1, and the uninsured spouses of these custodial parents, with net family incomes from 100% up to and including 130% of the FPL and who are themselves not eligible for Medicaid under the State plan. Parent up to and including 130 % of the FPL are funded through title XIX.
- **Demonstration Population 3-** Uninsured custodial parents of children who are eligible under the Medicaid State plan or included in Demonstration Population 1, and the uninsured spouses of these custodial parents, with net family incomes above 130% up to and including 200% of the FPL and who are themselves not eligible for Medicaid under the State plan. Parents from 130 up to and including 200 % of the FPL are funded through title XXI.

Enrollment

(As of 12/31/07)

- There are currently about 50,085 enrollees in the BadgerCare demonstration with coverage under title XXI.

Benefits

- The demonstration enrollees will receive the Medicaid State plan benefits through the Wisconsin Medicaid managed care delivery system, or BadgerCare can pay premiums to enroll families into their employer-sponsored health insurance. To qualify for the Health Insurance Premium Purchase (HIPP) program, the employer must pay at least 40 percent, but less than 80 percent of a family premium. In addition, the cost of the

family premium, plus required wrap-around costs (coinsurance, deductibles, BadgerCare services not covered by the health plan) equal to BadgerCare coverage, must be cost-effective compared to enrollment into the managed care delivery system

- Transportation, family planning services, prenatal care coordination, targeted case management, dental services, chiropractic services, school-based services and tuberculosis-related services are reimbursed on a fee-for-service basis.

Cost Sharing

- Families with incomes above 150% of the FPL must pay a premium of 5% of the family income.
- There are no other co-pays or deductibles.

Delivery System

- Recipients will utilize the managed care delivery system in place for eligibles in the Medicaid State Plan and fee-for service.

Funding Projections

- Title XIX funding \$ 477 million
- Title XXI funding \$ 367 million

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
