Drugs of Abuse Testing

Coding Guidelines

G0430 (Drug screen, qualitative; multiple drug classes other than chromatographic method, each procedure) is a replacement for CPT codes 80100 (Drug screen, qualitative; multiple drug classes chromatographic method, each procedure) and 80104 (multiple drug classes other than chromatographic method, each procedure). Effective for dates of service on or after January 1, 2010, CPT code 80100 will no longer be active. This CPT coding change was made to limit billing to one (1) time per procedure and to remove the limitation of method (chromatographic) which made CPT 80100 inappropriate in many instances.

Effective for dates of service on or after January 1, 2010, G0431 (Drug screen, qualitative; single drug class method (e.g. immunoassay, enzyme assay), each drug class) is a direct replacement for CPT code 80101 (Drug screen, qualitative; single drug class method (e.g., immunoassay, enzyme assay), each drug class). Use the following CPT codes for drug confirmation and quantitative drug testing

80154	Benzodiazepines
80299	Quantitation of drug, not elsewhere specified
82055	Alcohol (ethanol); any specimen except breath
82145	Amphetamine or methamphetamine
